BASIC SEWING AND WORKSHOP REQUIREMENTS

Sewing machine in working order. (It is a good idea to have your sewing machine operating manual with it.)

Spare needles for sewing machine

1/4" foot for machine if you have one

Stitch in the Ditch foot for your machine if you have one

Even Feed Foot

Neutral Colour Thread for both top and bobbin

Thread to match your project

Fabric Scissors

Scissors with pointy end that will cut fabric

9 ½" square ruler (if possible) or a 6 " or 6 ½" square ruler

24" ruler (for cutting strips)

12" ruler

1" x 6" ruler is handy but not necessary

Rotary Cutting Board (at least 18 $^{\prime\prime}$ x 24 $^{\prime\prime}$ if at all

possible)

Rotary Cutter with a sharp blade, (and a spare blade)

(If you do not use your rotary cutter for cutting $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right) \left($

batting, bring along another that you do use.)

Straight Pins

Safety pins or whatever you use to hold your quilt

layers together

Pencils for marking on both light and dark fabrics

Purple thang or something to use for stuffing corners.

Sewing needle

I ron and I roning Board if you have a small board available. (There are usually 2 boards and 2 irons available at the Senior's Centre.) (If you can arrange

to share with someone else, we won't trip the

breakers.)

Extension Cords

Stitch Ripper

Thimble

Notepad and pencil for taking notes

A container to put your cut off threads in

Money or cheque book in case your instructor has

supplies to be purchased

Indoor shoes if the weather is wet & sloppy
